By the time you read this article chances are the mid-term elections have come and gone. At this time, we, as organized labor and advocates for working men and women and their families, will either have on our happy faces or be crying in our beer. The campaign ads bombarding the airways have been about dog lovers and trashcan comedians and not about the issues. I hope the voters saw through the rhetoric and voted for what is in the best interest of America's working families. The next issue of this newsletter will tell this story. If you didn't register and vote, you haven't gained the right to criticize.

One issue that was not talked about on the campaign trail was healthcare. If you complain about such issues and did nothing at the polls to show your anger, then just open your wallet because it's going to get worse before it gets better. Let me give you an example: I was recently reading a newsletter from another U. A. Local regarding healthcare coverage for retirees being raised effective July 1, 2006. This article did not show the amount of the increase, so keep in mind our cost for retirees and their spouses as you read this information.

1. Retiree and spouse HMO medical and insured prescription drug plan, plus dental and vision care, between \$750.00 and \$1,040.00 monthly
2. Retiree and spouse PPO medical and insured prescription drug plan, plus dental and vision care, \$1,800.00 monthly

As you can see, healthcare costs are rising out of control. Hopefully, our political balance will be restored and Congress and this administration will focus on the welfare of America's working families and not corporate greed.

Also, as you will soon read, our Local Union is preparing for its election of officers who will serve for the next three years. As I stated at our last General Convention when nominating our

Business Manager, John E. McKee, Jr. for District 2 Vice President, our Local has experienced sound leadership for the last three decades. My concern is: who will lead our Union for the next three decades? Apathy is the ruination of any organization. I look out at the members attending our monthly Union meeting and I see the same faces, many of whom are on the short side of their career, as am I. It's time for the next generation to look around and realize that the preservation of our organization will rest on their shoulders. Like I stated in the first part of this article, if you don't get involved, participate and give back, this organization will also decline. Remember the saying, "P ___ Poor Planning Produces P ___ Poor Results." It's your future at stake!

In the event of a tie vote for any of these offices, a run-off election will be held between those candidates on Saturday, December 16, 2006 at the U. A. Mechanical Trade School located at 8509 Ardwick-Ardmore Road, Landover, Maryland from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.

Section 18 (D) states, "Any journeyman member nominated for office must be present the night of nomination, or vouched for by the member who nominated him/her that he/she will accept the position if elected." Also, Section 18 (E) states, "No journeyman member can be nominated, elected or appointed to office who has not been a member of the Local two (2) years immediately prior to the date of election, or who owes or has paid a reinstatement within this period of time. Nor shall a member vote at any election of any description unless he/she has been a member for a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the date of election or who owes or has paid a reinstatement within this period of time."

At our September Union meeting the body voted and approved expenditures for our annual Christmas party to be held at our December membership meeting. It was also moved and seconded that all attending the party would contribute a \$20.00 cash gift to be put towards the apprentice annual holiday fundraiser for needy families in our area. Reminder! Reminder! Reminder!

The Medical Fund requires coordination of benefits with Medicare eligible retirees and eligible dependents. It is important that you and/or your dependents enroll for Medicare at age 65, or if disabled prior to age 65, when you are eligible for Medicare coverage. Be sure to enroll in both part "A" and part "B" of Medicare. Failure to do so will result in lower medical protection and greater out-of-pocket experience. Refer to "Coordination with Medicare" in the plan's Summary Plan description.

Parents with dependent children over the age of 19 and attending college or junior college programs in full time status must provide the Medical Fund Office with a student certification from their school in order to maintain medical eligibility. Don't forget - don't suffer a break in coverage for your child.
